



Glossary: Teacher Managed Behaviors (Minors)

Defiance- Student engages in occasional, brief, or low-intensity failure to follow directions.

Disrespect- Student delivers low intensity socially rude or dismissive messages to adults or students.

Disruption- Student engages in low intensity disturbance that interrupts an event, activity or process.

Inappropriate Language- Student engages in low intensity harmful or offensive language; may be directed at others

Physical Aggression- Student engages in low intensity, non-serious physical contact or aggression.

Property Misuse- Student engages in low intensity, non-intended use of property.

Tardy- Student arrives at class after the bell (or signal that class has started)

Technology Violation- Student engages in non-serious but inappropriate (as defined by the school) use of cell phone, music/ video players, camera, computers, and/ or other electronic devices.

Reflection Worksheet Support

- Used only after classroom interventions have not been met with success.
- Take concrete action to correct behavior (teacher detention, reflective writing).
- Corrective actions correspond to demonstrated behavior where possible.
- Administered with student knowledge and feedback.
- Use as an opportunity to reteach expected behaviors.
- **No student will receive a consequence from a reflection sheet- its purpose is to create a dialog about a specific behavior.**
- **Behaviors will be tracked through synergy this year.**

Glossary: Office Managed Behaviors (MAJOR)

Detrimental Behavior:

Behavior on or off school grounds that is detrimental to the safety or welfare of other students or staff.

Bullying/ Harassing:

Any written or oral expression, physical or electronic act or gesture, or a pattern thereof that is intended to coerce, intimidate or cause any physical, mental or emotional harm to any student. A student must be given an opportunity to stop.

Disobedience/ Defiance/ Interference:

Being willfully disobedient or openly and persistently defiant or repeatedly interfering with the schools ability to provide educational opportunities.

Major Dishonesty:

Plagiarism, copying- cheating or lying that causes physical or emotional harm.

Threat of attack:

A threat that refers to an act where there was no physical contact between the offender and victim but the victim felt that physical harm could have occurred based on verbal or non verbal communication by the offender.

Fighting:

Knowingly and recklessly causes physical bodily injury to another person. This will be a violent confrontation or struggle between one or more students.

Profane/ Vulgar Language:

Directing profanity, vulgar language, or obscene gestures or verbal abuse name calling or ethnic or racial slurs or screaming toward a student or staff member.
