SOCIAL AND EMOTIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Social and Emotional Development refers to the skills necessary to foster secure attachment with adults; maintain healthy relationships; regulate behavior and emotions; and develop a healthy concept of personal identity and executive functioning. Positive social and emotional development provides an important foundation for lifelong development and learning. Social and Emotional Development includes mental health, crisis counseling, substance use disorder, physical/sexual abuse and neglect, LGBTQ+ resources, and diversity programs and services.
